Job Title/Position: Hospice Chaplain/Bereavement

Reports To: *Manager of Clinical Services*

JOB DESCRIPTION SUMMARY

The Hospice Chaplain is responsible for the provision of spiritual care services to patients and families/caregivers of St. Croix Hospice, either directly or through coordination of care with other spiritual counselors.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS/RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Assures spiritual assessment of patients and families/caregivers in the hospice program and appropriate services are rendered in a timely manner.
- 2. Develops an individualized the plan of care by participating in the comprehensive assessment to meet identified spiritual needs.
- 3. Provides direct spiritual care to patients and families/caregivers.
- 4. Serves as liaison and support to community chaplains and spiritual counselors.
- 5. Maintains records of spiritual care services utilization and related activities for quality assurance, program development, and policies and procedures review and revision.
- 6. Documents direct services and ongoing communication with community chaplains and spiritual counselors.
- 7. Attends patient care conference and interdisciplinary group meetings as a member of the interdisciplinary group.
- 8. Provides consultation, education, and support to the interdisciplinary group on spiritual care.
- 9. Recruits community chaplains, spiritual counselors, and spiritual care volunteers adequate to meet patient and family/caregiver needs by developing community contacts and offering education through congregations about hospice care.
- 10. Assists the Director of Bereavement in maintaining a bereavement program to meet the needs of families/caregivers for 13 months following the death of a patient to ensure compliance with all state, federal, and CHAP regulatory requirements.
- 11. Ensures the initial bereavement assessment is completed, or assigned to appropriate team member.
- 12. Ensures a condolence call is made, or assigned to be made to the bereaved.
- 13. Assigns and oversees volunteers making bereavement calls.
- 14. Assists with maintaining, organizing, and updating support group schedule.
- 15. Provides for funeral or memorial services for patients as requested.

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16. Plans periodic memorial services to meet the needs of personnel, volunteers, and community clergy/spiritual counselors working with the hospice team.

- 17. Assists in supervision of spiritual care volunteers when assigned to patients/families/caregivers.
- 18. Actively participates in quality assessment performance improvement teams and activities.
- 19. Accepts and performs other related duties and responsibilities as required.

The above statements are intended to be a representative summary of the major duties and responsibilities performed by incumbents of this job. The incumbents may be requested to perform job-related tasks other than those stated in this description.

- 1. Bachelor's degree required. Graduate of accredited seminary or school of theology (BD, MDiv or equivalent theological degree) preferred
- 2. One or more unit(s) of Clinical Pastoral Education preferred
- 3. Ability to work as member of interdisciplinary group
- 4. Comfort in an interfaith setting
- 5. Ability to accept different lifestyles, cultures, beliefs and values
- 6. Ability to network with community clergy and congregations
- 7. Hospice experience preferred
- 8. Must be a licensed driver with an automobile that is insured in accordance with state or organization requirements and is in good working order
