





Cohoes is a small city in the Capital Region of NY with a rich history. Based on its location, the confluence of the Mohawk and Hudson Rivers, it became the beginning of the Erie Canal. Known as "Spindle City," it was a thriving textile mill city at the turn of the last century, drawing immigrant workers from all over at the time. The Capital Region continues to be a draw for immigrants of many nationalities, the world at our doorstep. Cohoes is currently going to great efforts to revitalize itself, preserving its historical nature while also developing its economic imprint. Its proximity to the Adirondacks, lakes, and rivers also makes it an appealing place for outdoor enthusiasts.

Cohoes was home to many churches in the last century, particularly Catholic, serving the numerous immigrant populations working in its mills. But in 2019, the Barna Foundation ranked Albany as the 6th most post-Christian city in the nation (https://www.barna.com/research/post-christian-cities-2019/), down from 1st in 2010 (the top 8 all in NY/New England). As such, the cooperation of churches is important, as the gospel is so needed, and UCC has been part of a coalition of pastors, Protestant and Catholic, for many years, praying and partnering in ministry.

Executive Insight Report

UCC HISTORY

The church is named "United Church of Cohoes" because it is the result of the 1969 amalgamation of the Silliman Memorial Presbyterian Church and the Dutch Reformed Church of Cohoes, in which the new congregation took the Dutch Reformed church building and the Presbyterian denominational affiliation.

On June 1, 1977 Rev. Nicholas E. TeBordo and Rev. Terrie J. Stine-TeBordo graduated from Princeton Seminary. In search of a church who would take a husband-and-wife team they heard the call to The United Church of Cohoes and started work there the very weekend they graduated. (cont.)





UCC HISTORY (cont.)

For the next 26 years, the duo would pour their hearts and souls into the congregation and the community. Terrie created a thriving youth program and counseled many through sickness and grief. Nick's excitement and passion radiated in the city, bringing in new families that would soon call the church "home". Even after Terrie's sudden passing in 2003 the congregation continued to carry out God's work and still does to this day. Pastors Nick & Terrie rooted the church in our community and developed relationships and ties that continue to flourish today.

Love for the city and its people in need has always been a priority, as evidenced by its ongoing ministries. UCC hosts Alcoholics Anonymous to welcome those struggling with addictions. It has an active food pantry and clothes closet and hosts weekly community meals (partnering with other local churches) as per Jesus' instructions in Matthew 25 to feed those who are hungry and clothe those who are in need. In years past, UCC bussed and fed hundreds of children for numerous children's programs, many of whom remain significant covenant partners in ministry today as adults.

In 2015, UCC re-affiliated with the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterian Churches. In the fall of 2018, United Church joined a Church Transformation Cohort with 8 other churches in our denomination. The goal of the cohort was to evaluate the church's health, create "prescriptions" that would help the church flourish, and equip our leadership to accomplish the vision that God has given us. Since then, we have undergone a major "facelift", completely changed our organizational structure, and realigned our mission.

Between November of 2018 and September of 2023, Rev. Kaitlyn Wood served as the lead pastor at UCC. She has since taken a position with ECO as the National Director of Church Health, in which we wish her every success. Pastor Nick continues to serve as the associate pastor of Care and Senior ministry.

NEW BEGINNINGS

We believe that God is leading the United Church of Cohoes into a new season of ministry. Like churches all over the US, we have seen challenges to church attendance in recent years, particularly since the pandemic. We have an active online presence in addition to our in-person attendance, but look forward to the leadership and creativity of a new pastor to take us to a new level in our own discipleship and outreach to our community. Building on the values of community and service taught by Pastor Kaitlyn, we the church are working to rediscover our unique purpose and vision for this region.
