RESPONSIBILITIES

Oversee Children's Ministries

- 1. Collaborate with the Senior Pastor to develop and implement a discipleship plan for children at First Baptist that emphasizes fun and play as vital tools for building relationships and spiritual growth.
- 2. Communicate and implement the plan with Children's Ministry leaders, parents, and the Nursery Committee to maintain a unified vision.
- 3. Recruit, train, and support volunteers, ensuring they understand their role and purpose in discipling children.
- 4. Promote Children's Ministry opportunities within the church and to the broader Kearney community, creating and maintaining outreach efforts that share the Gospel and invite community involvement.
- 5. Ensure a safe, welcoming environment by upholding the church's Abuse Prevention and Risk Management policies; attend related meetings to support ongoing safety standards.
- 6. Coordinate ministry efforts and facility use with other church staff.
- 7. Manage and oversee the Children's Ministry budget.

Be a Full Participant in the Life of the Church

- 1. Participate in church life in a way that exemplifies Hebrews 10:24-25.
- 2. Be supportive of wider church efforts and vision.
- 3. Use any gifts to the service of the church, as able.

EVALUATION

10 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT KEARNEY

Kearney, Nebraska, is a mid-sized, growing city of 33,000 in central Nebraska, situated on I-80, about two and a half hours west of Omaha and five hours east of Denver.

- 1. A massive Arch spans I-80, serving as a multi-level museum that tells the story of the adventurers who followed the Great Platte River Road to help build America.
- 2. Kearney is proud to be the Sandhill Crane Capital of the World. Each spring, over half a million cranes—about 80% of the global population—gather in the Platte River Valley, with many viewing experiences available.
- 3. The University of Nebraska at Kearney (UNK), home of the Lopers, gives the town a lively, student-driven vibe with plenty of great food options.
- 4. Downtown Kearney, known as "On the Bricks," features locally owned shops, seasonal events, murals, museums, restaurants, and a theater.
- 5. Kearney boasts a dozen museums and cultural exhibits, including the Museum of Nebraska Art, Ft. Kearny Historical Center, Kearney Area Children's Museum, and Trails & Rails Pioneer Museum.
- 6. Enjoy the outdoors with over 20 miles of paved trails, kayaking, paddleboarding, splash pads, fishing, camping, and birdwatching in beautiful parks and wildlife areas.
- 7. As Nebraska's cultural heart, Kearney hosts theater, concerts, and performances year-round at venues like Viaero Event Center, Merryman Performing Arts Center, and the World Theatre. Summer brings outdoor theater and weekly live music.
- 8. Our annual events give people a reason to come visit year after year. Cruise Nite, State Cross Country, Cattlemen's Classic, Shrine Bowl, Sandhill Crane Migration, Art in the Park, and Nebraska Senior Games are just a few of the epic events hosted right here in Kearney.
- 9. Tempt your palate with an assortment of restaurants featuring local flare, international, cafes and bakeries, and good of Nebraska beef. Kearney has loads of unique local eateries, food trucks, and an impressive food scene.
- 10. The city hosts numerous sports tournaments and events with top-notch facilities, including the Kearney SportsPlex, Ernest Grundy Indoor Tennis Center, premier Little League complex, and the USHL's Tri-City Storm. You'll also find BMX, golf, drag racing, and slower-paced options like frisbee golf, pickleball, and footgolf.
